Member Organisation Web Pages

A while back an email was sent to all MO Secretaries advising that we are finalising group page administration and would be grateful if you could help with the completion of some documentation, to help us identify login details for the groups and if a 'local information' page is required. We are still missing a lot of forms, so would kindly ask that if you haven't filled out the documents yet, that you do so asap, so we can get you up and running.

Login Details

Previously a single login was made available to groups, however in line with recommended IT security practice, we will issue login details per user so login detail are assigned to individuals only. For this reason we strongly discourage sharing login details please. Each user login will only allow that individual access to administer their own group page.

Local Information page

Where required by the group, we will add a 'local information' link to your group page menu. This will enable details such as 'local hospitals', 'local clinics', 'local SCNs' or similar to be added to the page in a structured format, in keeping with the style of the website.



The template we sent out allows for completion of the details in the simplest form so we can create the page with content on your behalf before handing over for your continued administration. If the page requires the upload of files, e.g. previous presentations from local events, please indicate this on the template and email them to caroline.bramwell@iasupport.org.

The template provides for up to six links on the local information page to different local information; if you require additional links please add as required to the word or PDF document.

Once we receive your completed form we will issue login details and a guide to updating group pages to the named individuals and create your local information page, where indicated.

What are you hearing?

We are receiving enquiries from individuals and through our member organisations about concerns around members not being able to receive their usual preferred products via prescription, or from their usual delivery company. We'd like to know if you are receiving queries about this in your area?

We are aware of local CCG product formularies, where CCGs, or groups of CCGs, have agreed a list of 'accepted' products and recommended brands. This particularly applies to additional (accessory) products.

Please email the office with any concerns being raised, as we'd like to identify if this is occurring in any particular areas.

As this is such a current topic of interest we have invited Zarah Perry-Woodford to speak about prescription management services at our Information Day on 26th March.

Pouchitis Study

In the Autumn issue of *IA Journal*, we featured a study being undertaken by MAC Clinical Research for a potential treatment for chronic pouch inflammation in patients with ulcerative colitis. We have been advised that this study is now complete but there is a strong possibility of a secondary part commencing around Q3 2022.
