IA Information Day 2025

Thank you to everyone who joined us in April for our annual Information Day. If we do say so ourselves, it was a fantastic event, which saw attendees come together to learn from subject matter experts, meet old friends, discover the latest innovations from a host of ostomy suppliers and have a rip-roaring time at the after-party hoedown!

Of four scheduled workshops dedicated to: solutions to internal pouch problems; stress management; work-related support; and sex, attendees could choose to attend two. They were facilitated by a mix of expert presenters, researchers and IA volunteers addressing common and not-so-common health and wellbeing matters with empathy, insight and a little humour.

The Bryan Brooke Lecture was delivered by Mr Dominic Slade FRCS, Consultant Colorectal, Intestinal Failure and General Surgeon, on the topic of parastomal hernia. IA's President, Professor Gordon Carlson presented him with the Bryan Brooke Medal after the talk.

Presentations were made to West Yorkshire IA, winner of IA's 11th annual Inspire Award for innovation and to long-serving volunteer Anne Cross of Greater Manchester IA, who is stepping down after 50 years of service.

Anne (pictured right with Prof. Carlson) later shared her IA story: "Aged 27 and newly married I was devastated by my surgery.





"I was visited in hospital by Joyce Fitzpatrick, secretary of IA, and consequently joined the association. Going forward, I was asked to become Visiting Officer and as I really wanted to help fellow patients, served in this capacity for 35 years. I visited patients in virtually every hospital in Greater Manchester and in their homes. I spoke regularly about life with an ileostomy to nurses training to be SCNs at the then Hope Hospital (Salford Royal Hospital) and to Professor Irving's medical students at Manchester University.

"I give grateful thanks to IA for all its support and friendships formed over the years."

Rounding off the evening, 'The Last Chance Saloon Band' took to the stage with their barnstorming beats.

Thanks to our brilliant line-up of speakers and to Greater Manchester IA for the warm welcome to their city, and the small army of volunteers who ensured the event ran smoothly.

The NHS national booking system has opened for thousands of people to book their spring Covid-19 vaccination. Those eligible for this year's vaccine include people with severe heart, kidney, liver, respiratory, neurological or lung conditions, diabetes – and those with a weakened immune system due to disease or treatment.
