Have your say... Complete IA's UK airport survey



As reported in the August IA Update, IA is concerned that UK airports are not held to account in meeting their accessibility obligations through their Airports Accessibility Framework and that much more needs to be done to ensure that the rights of anyone wearing a medical device, such as a stoma bag, are respected.

For those with a complaint about a UK airport, this should be taken up with the airport in the first instance, but <u>further action is available through the CAA if you are dissatisfied with the response</u>.

There is no fee for the course but delegates, or their member organisations, are responsible for their own travel expenses and we would suggest contacting your member organisation to discuss what financial assistance they may be able to offer, should this be required.
