Exercise best practice recommendations published



Sarah Russell MSc, Clinical Exercise Specialist, has been leading a project on behalf of the Association of Stoma Care Nurses (ASCN UK) to develop best practice recommendations for exercise and physical activity after stoma surgery. The recommendations from the 'EXPASS' project (Exercise and Physical Activity after Stoma Surgery) are now published on the ASCN UK website.



Sarah said: "Under the umbrella of the ASCN UK, I have been project lead and co-author — alongside my brilliant colleague physio Kerry Archer — and together with our expert panel of surgeons, nurses, physios and other patients, we have basically published the world's first guidelines, and they have been endorsed by many other global nursing and physiotherapy groups.

"We have created visual aids and tools to help put it into practice. And we hope this helps to simplify it and give people a starting point and a framework on which to base their recovery pathways and long-term goals."

Whilst the recommendations are aimed at healthcare, medical and exercise professionals and <u>published on the ASCN UK website</u>, they are accessible and available to everyone and we'd fully encourage taking a look and downloading a copy.

IA's UK airport survey still open: your opinion counts

Local formularies patient survey: have your say

A <u>patient survey</u> is being run on behalf of the Department of Health and Social Care who will use your responses to develop good practice guidance on the development and use of local formularies for prescribing medical devices that patients will use either at home or in the community.

Apart from National Institute for Health and Care Excellence (NICE) guidance on developing local formularies (Overview | Developing and updating local formularies | Guidance | NICE), there is no central support for NHS teams in developing and maintaining local formularies for medical devices prescribed through the Part IX Drug Tariff for use by patients at home or in the community.

Industry and patient groups say NHS teams operate local formularies differently and variation may mean patients are not always prescribed the most appropriate medical devices for them to use at home and/or in the community.

Analysis of survey responses will help develop local formularies 'good practice' guidance to:

- Improve the appropriateness of local formulary prescription of medical devices.
- Provide a framework to support clinical decision-making.
- Ensure patients are at the heart of decisions about clinically appropriate prescribing of medical devices.
- Improve long term stability for medical device manufacturing businesses.
- Support the aims of the 10 Year Health Plan and Life Science Sector Plan to streamline the innovation pathway.



Support and insight at IA Northern Ireland Information Day at Ulster University

IA Northern Ireland hosted a Stoma Information Day on 18 October at Ulster University's Magee campus. The event brought together members, stoma care nurses, and researchers for a day focused on learning, connecting, and wellbeing.



IA Northern Ireland committee member, Niamh Magee, said: "We were delighted to present two new training torsos to the stoma care team at the Western Health and Social Care Trust. These will support nurse education and patient training, helping to enhance the standard of stoma care across the Trust."

The morning session featured engaging presentations from the Stomasense Research Group at Ulster University, who shared insights on the importance of participating in stoma research, the psychological impacts of surgery, and useful coping strategies. They also provided an update on their ongoing research projects, all aimed at improving quality of life and wellbeing for people living with a stoma.

Midday activities gave attendees a chance to unwind and connect. Some enjoyed a guided walk around the beautiful Magee campus, while others took part in a seated Pilates session led by committee member and physiotherapist, Gillian Clarke. Both options proved popular, offering a space for light-hearted conversation in equal measure.

Lively conversation filled the room over lunch, and the day concluded with an informative talk on 'Nutrition with a stoma' by dietitian Hannah Scott. Hannah offered practical advice on maintaining a balanced diet and managing common challenges following surgery.

Niamh added: "The event was a great success and reflected the strong sense of community within IA Northern Ireland. Members left feeling informed, uplifted, and supported. The committee extends sincere thanks to everyone who attended, as well as to the Stomasense Research Group and Ulster University for their warm hospitality and contribution to a truly inspiring day."

Stoma care podcast award nomination

On 22 October, IA's PR & Communications Manager, Caroline Bramwell, attended the Nursing Times Awards in London along with ASCN UK, as the podcast series which she had worked on with them, as part of the Patient Pathway project, was shortlisted for the 'Continence Promotion and Care Award'.

The ASCN UK 'Beyond the Bag: Challenging Differences in Stoma Care' podcast explores the entire

patient journey, from diagnosis and surgery to discharge home, and extends to look at life with a stoma. The podcast also explores the psychological adaptation to life with a stoma, and aims to highlight and educate on the inequalities and variations in stoma care services compared to other chronic long-term conditions.
